Evaluation (Exams)	To evaluate their knowledge and proficiency, attendees are required to take examinations. The take-home exams are due one week after the seminar class. Applicants will also be evaluated on their participation during seminar exercises. A Certificate of Module Completion will be given to participants successfully completing each seminar module. Certification is only given to those who attend all four module programs within a two year period and pass all examinations. Individuals will be notified by letter 4-6 weeks after the final seminar and will receive a Certified Workers' Compensation Certificate.
